After a whole day and night spent in prayer and fasting - crying out for the lost souls-on Kanjoka Mountain, one woman was baptized and God moved in miracles of healing and deliverance as people suffering from different sicknesses and diseases received prayer including some suffering from asthma and even HIV/AIDS."

Since those early days of evangelization to the Matindi area, Pastor Mapira reports of extensive outreach to the villages of Ling'awa, Harry, and the Chikwarwa and Blantyre regions. Pastor writes.... Jesus said, "Go and make disciples." The word that is translated "GO" in the original Greek language is in a form that expresses great urgency. Jesus meant to say "Get going! Do not delay! Multiply until people of all nations, races, tribes and languages know and follow Me!" The Bride of Christ Ministries is being obedient to this God's command.

Dear Pastors & Ministers,

In our last communication, it was my purpose to instill in you the comforting thought that God is definitely in the business of using you for a time such as this. I made it a point to stress this truth because I am aware that Satan is diligently at work stirring up his lies in trying to discourage the church leadership. He knows that if he can affect the church leaders it will in turn devastate the flock. You need to know you are a precious gem which God Himself has faceted and polished through the many years devoted to ministry. God has brought you through a school that is not carried out within the walls of a classroom, but by your walk through valleys, deserts, and rough terrain. Trust me, those low moments you have gone through, moments of feeling isolated and at times in despair were not in vain. It is all just part of the greater scheme of God for your life.

Moses, within his desert times, took it upon himself to prepare a successor that would continue the work that God had already begun under the conviction that he had the responsibility to do so. I am persuaded, though scripture is not explicit, that Moses made an assessment of the type character that would be needed to carry out the work that lay ahead for the people of Israel. He did not have a resume on which to draw from when choosing Joshua; all he could see was the Godly spark that was reflected in young Joshua that qualified him for the work that needed to be continued.
